WHAT ARE WE LOOKING FOR IN TRUSTEES?

Primarily you need a genuine enthusiasm for live performance and a curiosity and open mindedness about what it takes to run our theatre successfully.

You'll be collaborative, supportive and generous with your experience and have the confidence to ask challenging questions in Board meetings. Don't worry if you have little or no experience at Board meetings - we offer a proper induction process and a Board buddy who'll support you as you find your feet. And our Board meetings are both friendly and informal. You'll need the time to attend those meetings in person (four times a year - with possible extra commitments on Committees) and you'll understand the difference between being a Board member and the operational side of what we do.

Under Charity Commission rules, all Board members take on some legal responsibility as they manage the risk of the theatre and its public funding so you would need to be comfortable with that obligation.

At the moment we want our Board to represent our city better and would be especially keen to hear from York's growing population of younger people. We also need more digital experience on our Board and, as our ambition grows, we would welcome applications from people who have been involved in performance or the Arts at a national level.

In return we can offer you a lot of fun with a fabulous team, as well as a tremendous opportunity to develop your interest in the Arts and performance. We can cover expenses and you'll also get two free tickets to all productions we create ourselves.

YORK THEATRE ROYAL

York Citizens' Theatre Trust was founded in 1936 and is the operating company of York Theatre Royal. It is a registered charity and a National Portfolio Organisation of Arts Council England.

The theatre is Grade 2* listed and is one of the oldest in the country, located in the heart of the historic city of York.

Today it is a vibrant and ambitious producing and presenting theatre with strong and embedded roots in it's wider community.

York Theatre Royal includes the Main House (761 seats)

and Studio (71 seats), with an extensive foyer area and catering facilities. We also rent a rehearsal space and off-site Wardrobe, Costume Hire and Production store.

2025/26 is the second year with new leadership - with CEO Paul Crewes and Chair of Trustees Helen Boaden in post. The vision of the Board and Executive is strongly aligned in an approach that is centred around organisational investment, bold artistic ambition and the desire to be an acclaimed producing house with a greater proportion of produced and co-produced work. Significant

progress has been made, with a number of high profile, ambitious productions and co-productions secured for 2025-26 and beyond. Securing international as well as UK based partnerships and funding has been instrumental in enabling this to happen.

The theatre's dance programme also continues to develop with a range of companies now coming to York including Ballet Black, Shobana Jeyasingh Dance, Rambert, London City Ballet and Lost Dog.

York Theatre Royal is nationally recognised for its work with children and young people. We help young people to develop new skills, explore their creativity, increase confidence and communication and embrace theatre as something which enriches their lives.

We also have an exceptional track record of working with and for our community, through a range of projects,

partnerships and networks.
One of the more recent
highlights being Sweet
Legacies - a project funded
by The National Lottery
Heritage Fund, the Joseph
Rowntree Foundation and the
Garfield Weston Foundation
- delivering over 80 creative
workshops in diverse spaces
across our city, alongside
our large-scale community
production, His Last Report, in
summer 2025.

York Theatre Royal has an annual turnover of just under £5 million and has a successful track record in generating significant levels of earned income.
